UCSB Design & Construction Services Contracting Services

The UCSB Design & Construction Services (DCS) department is responsible for the planning, design, construction, retrofitting, and restoration of campus buildings and other physical improvements. Within DCS, the Contracting Services group manages the advertisement and bidding of formal construction projects, and prepares and awards construction service agreements for both advertised and negotiated procurements. These services support DCS, Housing, Dining & Auxiliary Services, and Facilities Management among other UCSB client departments. In addition, Contracting Services prepares and administers a wide range of consultant services agreements for campus clients, including advertising consulting services.
